"When [Jesus] had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.'" --Luke 5:4

"Adventure isn't [just] hanging on a rope off the side of a mountain. Adventure is an attitude that we must apply to the day to day obstacles in life." --John Amatt

It was the highest eight feet I'd ever seen. Eight feet from the tip of the diving board to the surface of the water in the pool far below, at some long ago forgotten summer camp I attended. As a nervous kid I was really scared about diving off of the high board for the very first time and so I froze on that precipice. But somehow I knew I could not go back. I had to, in Jesus' words, put out into deep water. Time to go on to the next adventure of my childhood and so I finally found the courage and jumped!

Thank God I did! What would have I have missed if I'd not embraced that adventure, that movement ahead? Good life lesson. Good spiritual lesson. Good wisdom for us as a church. Because what makes life an adventure or a slog, an amazing journey or a frightening foray is all about the attitude, the faith we bring to the mystery called daily life. Mystery because try as hard as we might we just do not know what awaits us tomorrow, in the future.





Worship Services During the Elevator Project

As we approach the summer months and the days get longer and warmer, the commencement of the long anticipated elevator project grows closer. The project is scheduled to begin the week after worship concludes on June 10th and, provided there are no setbacks, is scheduled to be completed before the Holiday Season. Although disruption to worship will be kept as limited as possible, accommodations must be made.

The Deacons consulted with those members of the church who may regularly use the elevator to attend worship services. After speaking with them, it has been decided that the best solution to this temporary problem is to broadcast services in Fellowship Hall for those who rely on the elevator. There are several reasons that make this most logical solution. First, access is readily available and there is plenty of space for anyone wishing to sit downstairs. Second, there is a large screen television in Fellowship Hall and services can easily be broadcast live, from a camera placed in the balcony, without additional infrastructure work or equipment. Third, audio is also currently available in Fellowship Hall.

So, beginning with our first summer Worship on June 17th, space will be available to attend services in Fellowship Hall downstairs while services are being held in the sanctuary upstairs. The deacons will be prepared to make space for all who wish to join each Sunday. Considering the hot summer months, and how warm and stuffy the sanctuary gets, you may choose to give it a try!

As we enter this short, disruptive time for our church, we should take heed of Philippians 4:13, *"I can do all this through him who gives me strength."*

SCHOLARSHIP OFFERING



Exciting news! Habitat for Humanity is opening a Habitat ReStore right next door in Ashland and has reached out to Pilgrim Church for volunteers to help them get up and running! Read on to learn about the ReStore, and opportunities to help...

What is **ReStore? It is Habitat's open**-to-the-public retail outlet. ReStore sells new and gently used donated home furnishings and building materials. The proceeds from all items sold go to funding home build missions. The MetroWest/Greater Worcester ReStore generates enough funds to build a home a year, while also keeping over 600 tons of usable materials out of landfills!

The new Ashland ReStore is currently looking for volunteers to help get the new store going!

The Ashland ReStore is located at 310 Pond Street and is set to open sometime in June.

All those that join will be part of something new and everlasting!

Volunteers need to be 16 years of age or older to volunteer independently. ReStore can however host volunteers age 14 & 15 with a parent or legal guardian present. All volunteers under the age of 18 must have our waiver signed by a parent or legal guardian.

For the month of May the Ashland Habitat ReStore shifts are Tuesday-Saturday from 9:30AM-1:30PM. Come June they will be looking to host volunteers from 9:30AM-1:30PM and 1PM-5PM. Miracle on 25 S. Main Outreach Program By kate Potter and Janet Walsh

On Sunday December 10th, 2017 over 140 Pilgrim Church members and friends came together for the 3rd "Miracle on 25 South Main" food packaging event. People ages 3-85 measured, poured and boxed meals for 3 hours. Together we created 40,000 meals for people in need! Those meals were donated to My Brother's Keeper, in Stoughton, A Place to Turn food pantry in Natick, and hurricane relief groups in Puerto Rico. Deliveries were made possible by several Pilgrim Church 2018 confirmands and mentors.

For the past three years most of the expense of this wonderful event has been generously underwritten through an anonymous donation to Pilgrim Church. Additional fundraising by the Middle School Youth Group and Pilgrim Church member donations have allowed us to make the 40,000 meal total we achieved in both 2016 and 2017.

Overwhelming feedback indicated Pilgrim members would like to continue this annual advent tradition of giving! In order for us to plan for our 4th "Miracle" we needed to fundraise this spring to fund the meals. We are so very grateful for those who supported this program in the past, and for those whose donations are allowing us to once again partner with Matthew Martin and End Hunger New England.

ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT UPDATE

This is the fourth in a series of monthly reports on the status of the capital project that encompasses a commercial elevator for the sanctuary, an inclined platform lift from the sanctuary to the education wing and improved drainage for the south side of the sanctuary.

On May 11th the church signed a General Contract with R P Valois & Co. of Dartmouth, MA for \$311,260 covering the construction phase of the Accessibility Project. We are pleased to report that the general contractor's project schedule has them starting excavation in June and completing installation in October - two month ahead of our original target completion date of prior to Christmas! The major activities in the general contractor's construction schedule are as follows:

- Order elevator & obtain building permit May
- Demolish & excavate June
- Build masonry elevator shaft -July
- Install elevator hydraulics & cab August
- Finish carpentry & paint September
- Final inspection & completion October

We recently learned that our new elevator will need a variance from the State's Elevator Review Board, because its roomy interior dimensions of 6'5" W x 5' D are still too small to accommodate a stretcher. If the variance is not received soon it will delay the start of elevator fabrication thereby jeopardizing our target completion date for the project.

Hazard Warning to the Congregation

The installation of our new elevator requires major construction and, like any construction site, presents potential hazards to the public.

The demolition of the existing elevator and excavation for the new foundation will require heavy equipment operating on the South side of the building as well as egressing through the oval drive in front of the Church. During the entire construction process workers will need access to the elevator shaft landing openings on the first and second floors. To avoid accidental access by the public during non-working hours, the general contractor will be installing safety measures that include fencing around the job site and temporary walls at the elevator landings inside the church.

Pilgrim Church members are urged to use caution when approaching the construction site during the day and to respect the safety boundaries day and night. In addition parents are encouraged to keep close tabs on their children while at church during the construction period.

Charitable Giving If You're Over 70 1/2

FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

If you are over 70 ½ years old and have a traditional IRA, as you know, you must take an RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) from your IRA every year. What you might not know is that if you take all or a portion of that distribution as a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) that donation ends up being a tax deduction whether or not you itemize your deductions. You can even take the standard deduction in addition to the donation because **the QCD is deducted before the "adjusted gross income" is computed. Just remember, a QCD must be sent direct**ly to the charity from your IRA custodian.

For many younger tax payers, the new tax law makes taking the new larger standard deduction more likely. Because the tax advantage of a charitable deduction is only realized if tax payers itemize their deductions, all those itemizations together must be greater than the standard deduction.
