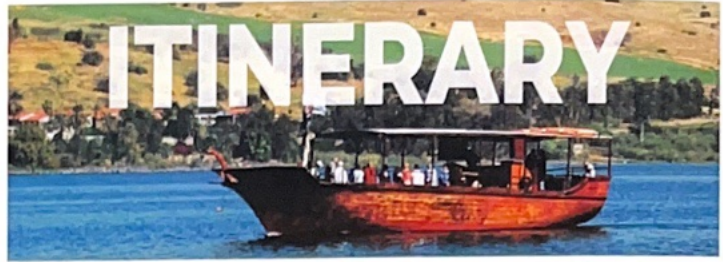
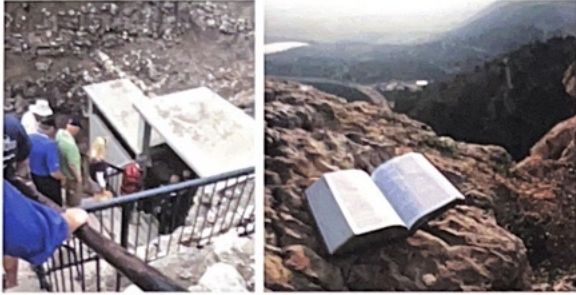

April 3 - Depart the USA

Your pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight.

April 4 - Arrive in Tel Aviv

Check into the Herzliya Hotel. Dinner is on your own.

April 5 - Caesarea Maritima/ Sepphoris/Nazareth/Overnight Ein Gev Kibbutz/ Shabbat dinner at Kibbutz

Visit the Roman aqueduct and theatre at Caesarea, a center of early Christianity (Acts 10) and where Paul was imprisoned for two years (Acts 23:33). Visit Sepphoris, the cosmopolitan Roman capital of Galilee until Herod Antipas built Tiberias. Conclude your day in Nazareth, Jesus' boyhood home (Matt. 2:23).

April 6 - Boat on the Sea of Galilee/ Jesus Boat Museum/Tabgha/ Primacy of Peter/ Mount of Beatitudes/ Capernaum/ Overnight Ein Gev/ Dinner at Kibbutz

Experience a special onboard worship service as you sail across the Sea of Galilee. At Kibbutz Nof Ginosar, see the 2,000-year-old "ancient boat," a rare example of the kind of boat in which Jesus might have sailed. Visit the Church of the Loaves and Fish in Tabgha, the traditional location of the feeding of the 5,000 (Luke 9:10 -17). As you pray in the Chapel of the Primacy, remember how Peter professed his devotion to the risen Christ three times (John 21). On the Mount of Beatitudes, contemplate the text of the Sermon on the Mount that Jesus preached there (Matt. 5-7). Enjoy a scenic drive to Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilee (Matt. 4:13, 23).

April 7 - Caesarea Philippi/ Bana'i Reserve/ Tel Dan/ Golan Heights/ Evening Jewelry Shop visit/ Overnight Ein Gev Kibbutz/ Dinner at Kibbutz

Travel to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter told the Lord, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the Living God!" (Matt. 16: 16). Walk through a portion of the Baniyas Reserve. At the ruins of Tel Dan, see the altar built by King Jeroboam I (1 Kings 12:25 -30) and learn about where the "House of David" fragment from the First Temple Period was discovered. A scenic drive along the Golan Heights will give you some beautiful views of Syria and Jordan as well as Israel. Remember your baptism at the Yardenit Baptismal site, where the Jordan River exits the Sea of Galilee on its journey southward (Matt. 3).

April 8 - Beit Shean/ Jericho/ Allenby Bridge/ Overnight Jordan Dead Sea Hotel/ Dinner at the Hotel

Start the day in Beit Shean, a city continuously inhabited for over 5,000 years. This is the city where Saul and his sons' bodies were hung from its walls (1 Sam. 31). The uncovered ruins date back to the Greek / Roman city that was part of the Decapolis of Jesus' day. See colonnaded streets with marble sidewalks, Roman public baths, and a theater. Travel to Jericho (the oldest city in the world) and visit the ruins of the ancient city conquered by Joshua (Joshua 6:1, 2 & 20). In the distance, you can see the traditional site of the Temptation of Jesus (Matthew 4:1 -11). Cross the Allenby Bridge into Jordan and check into your Dead Sea Hotel.

April 9 - Petra/ Overnight Jordan Dead Sea Hotel/ Dinner at the Hotel

Explore the city of Petra. Its entrance passes through a long, narrow gorge known as the Siq and can only be accessed by carriage, horseback or on foot. Once inside the city, marvel at the intricate detail of a city that was cut into the cliffsides of rose-colored rock. Return to your hotel at the Dead Sea.

April 10 - Masada/ Qumran/ Overnight Bethlehem Hotel/ Dinner with Palestinian Christian Family (Included for all guests)

Enjoy a visit to Masada, the spectacular mountaintop fortress built by Herod that later became the final tragic stronghold of the Jewish rebellion against the Romans. Ride the cable car to the top to explore the fortress and look down upon the remains of the Roman camps and siege ramp below. Continue to Qumran, the site of the Dead Sea Scroll discovery. This evening, enjoy a dinner with a local Palestinian Christian family.

April 11 - Ramallah/ Visit to Museum/ Visit to Refugee Camp/ Bethany/ Overnight Bethlehem/ Dinner at the Hotel/ Meeting with Rossing Center (Jew, Muslim and Christian Women)

Travel to Ramallah and visit the Palestinian Museum there. Continue to a refugee camp (conditions permitting).

April 12 - Bethlehem/ Church of the Nativity/ Shepherds' Field/ Shopping/ Model of Jerusalem/ Overnight Jerusalem hotel/ Dinner at the Hotel

In Bethlehem, visit the cave where Jesus was born (Luke 2:1-7) and the Church of the Nativity. Gaze out over Shepherds' Field, where angels first proclaimed the Good News. Explore the Israel Museum and its first-century model of the City of Jerusalem.

April 13 - Ascension chapel/ Mount of Olives/ Palm Sunday Walk/ Church of Dominus Flevit/ Gethsemane/ Church of All Nations/ Pool of Bethesda/ Via Dolorosa/ Church of the Holy Sepulchre/ Evening on Ben Yehuda Street/ Overnight Jerusalem/ Dinner on your own

Stop at the Chapel of the Ascension to remember the commission of Christ to His followers (Acts 1). Stand on the Mount of Olives and enjoy a remarkable view of the Golden City of Jerusalem. Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven from this place (Acts 1:9-12). Continue down the Palm Sunday Walk to Dominus Flevit Church, built to commemorate where Jesus wept over the city. Pray in the Garden of Gethsemane beneath the ancient olive trees (Matthew 26:36-44). See the Church of All Nations built here. See where Jesus healed on the Sabbath at the Pool of Bethesda (John 5: 1-18). Walk the Via Dolorosa ("the Way of the Cross") to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (John 19), built over the traditional sites of the crucifixion and burial of Jesus.

April 14 - Church Service in Old City (Lutheran Church?)/ Western Wall/ Southern Steps/ Yad Vashem/ Art Museum/ Overnight Jerusalem/ Dinner is on your own

You can journey to a church service in Jerusalem. Spend time in prayer at the Western Wall (the only remnant of the Second Temple of Jerusalem) and sit on the Teaching Steps where Jesus taught. Visit Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Memorial, with its poignant exhibits honoring the lives lost during the Holocaust. See an Art Museum.

April 15 - Temple Mount/ Chagall Windows at Hadassah Medical Center/ Tel Aviv/ Free time/ Dinner is on your own

Conditions permitting, walk across the Temple Mount. Travel to see the Chagall Windows at the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center. This afternoon, you will travel to Tel Aviv for free time in the city before checking into your hotel.

April 16 - Morning On Your Own/ Afternoon Visit to Joppa (Final Festive Dinner Together)

Enjoy a morning on your own in the largest city in Israel on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea. This afternoon, travel to Joppa where Jonah fled the call of the Lord here (Jonah 1) and cedars for the First Temple were brought here from Lebanon (II Chronicles 2). Enjoy a final dinner here, and then prepare for your return flights.
